# Report of Marriage between Filipinos or a Filipino and a Foreign National

The marriage of a Filipino should be reported to and registered with the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the Philippine Consulate General having jurisdiction over the locality where the event took place (i.e. Guam, Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands, Republic of Palau, Federated States of Micronesia & Republic of Marshall Islands).

## **BASIC REQUIREMENTS:**

 Five (5) original duly-accomplished Report of Marriage form, typed or printed legibly in black or blue ink, signed by both husband and wife. If submitting by mail, the completed forms must be notarized.

2. One (1) original or certified true copy and submit five (5) photocopies of the Marriage Certificate (original will be

returned)

3. Five (5) photocopies of valid passport of both husband and wife

4. Five (5) photocopies of Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) birth certificate of Filipino spouse

5. Five (5) photocopies of PSA Certificate of No Marriage (for a Filipino spouse)

6. Five (5) photocopies of Green card or valid visa (for a Filipino spouse)

7. One (1) original signed affidavit of delayed registration of marriage, if filed after a year from the date of marriage

 If submitting by mail, self-addressed return envelope, with appropriate stamps for express or priority mail with tracking numbers via US Postal Service, or with pre-paid mailing envelope from private courier of choice, if Report of Marriage is to be mailed back.

 Processing fee of \$25.00 (non-refundable) for Report of Marriage & \$25.00 for the affidavit of delayed registration of marriage, payable in cash, or postal money order, or cashier's check, made payable to "Philippine Consulate

General". Personal checks and credit cards are not accepted.

10. For applicants residing in U.S. territories or other countries within the jurisdiction of the Philippine Consulate General, applicants should enclose a postal money order of Cashier's check payable to the courier of choice (i.e. DHL Express or FedEx), to cover cost of mailing, and a corresponding self-addressed courier's address label. Personal checks are not accepted.

**Note:** The Philippine Consulate General assumes no responsibility for any delay or loss in the mail, or while the documents are in the custody of the courier service. The applicant should note the tracking numbers of all envelopes used and submitted.

### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

A. IF FILIPINO SPOUSE WAS PREVIOUSLY MARRIED AND DIVORCED, OR PREVIOUSLY MARRIED AND MARRIAGE WAS SUBSEQUENTLY ANNULLED

One (1) original or certified true copy and five (5) photocopies of the Judicial Decree of Divorce or Annulment (original will be returned) or PSA Marriage Certificate with annotation "null and void"

Note: Article 26 of the Family Code of the Philippines or Executive Order No. 209 (as amended by E.O. No. 227, promulgated on 27 July 1987) provides that:

- All marriages solemnized outside the Philippines, in accordance with the laws in force in the country where they were solemnized, and valid there as such, shall also be valid in this country, except those prohibited under Articles 35, 37 and 38.
- Where a <u>marriage between a Filipino citizen and a foreigner is validly celebrated and a divorce is thereafter validly obtained abroad by the alien spouse</u> capacitating him or her to remarry, the Filipino spouse shall have capacity to remarry under Philippine law (underlining and highlighting supplied.)
- B. IF THE FILIPINO SPOUSE IS A WIDOW / WIDOWER

One (1) original or certified true copy and submit five (5) photocopies of **Death Certificate of deceased spouse** (original will be returned)

### C. OTHER REQUIREMENTS

The Consular Officer reserves the right to require additional proof or documents from an applicant, to prove his/her citizenship or identity pursuant to the Philippine Passport Law (R.A. 8239) and the Foreign Service Act. (R.A. 7157).
