

Dear Consular Client:

With reference to your email, we wish to inform you that **foreign passport holders** are still temporarily restricted entry to the Philippines under current regulations unless the traveler qualifies in one of the following :

1. Foreign spouses of Filipino nationals, regardless of nationality;
2. Foreign minor children, and foreign children with special needs (regardless of age) of Filipino nationals; and
3. Foreign parents of minor Filipino children and of Filipino children with special needs (regardless of age).

In addition to the standard requirements for a visa (9a), foreign spouses and parents/children should provide :

- a. Proof of Marriage or filiation;
- b. Birth Certificate to establish a relationship to Filipino national;
- c. Photocopy of the passport of the Filipino national;
- d. Proof of Citizenship of Filipino spouse or parent/child (Valid Philippine ID);
- e. Proof that Filipino spouse, parent, and or child of a foreign national is/are currently in the Philippines (i.e. Barangay Clearance as Proof of Residency);
- g. Or will be traveling with the Filipino spouse or parent/child, the PHL Consulate shall require documents such as, but not limited to, airline tickets, enrollment records, immigration, and arrival stamps, and/or;
- h. Affidavits or Certifications signed by local government officials where they reside.

Generally, a 9(a) visa will be required for foreign spouse/children/parents of a Filipino national. This requirement applies whether the foreign spouse/children/parents are traveling with Filipino national to or reuniting with Filipino national in the Philippines:

**Basic requirements for a 9(a) visa are:**

1. Completed non-immigrant visa form;
2. 2 x 2 photo (taken within last 6 months);
3. Valid Passport (at least 6 months validity from expected departure from PHL);
4. Round-trip or Itinerary (return) ticket to point of origin or onward ticket to next destination ;
5. Proof of financial means to support travel (e.g. recent bank statement with sufficient average daily balance, employment certificate indicating compensation, or other acceptable proof of capacity to support oneself in the Philippines);

**FEES:**

**For nationals of countries with visa agreement with the Philippines:**

1. Single entry valid for three (3) months US\$30.00;
2. Multiple entry valid for six (6) months US\$60.00; and
3. Multiple-entry valid for twelve (12) months US\$ 90.00

**For nationals of countries without visa agreement with the Philippines:**

1. Single entry valid for three (3) months US\$40.00;
2. Multiple entry valid for six (6) months US\$80.00; and
3. Multiple-entry valid for twelve (12) months US\$120.00

The foreign national traveler should qualify with all the above mentioned requirements and must be able to submit at the Consulate. Once the basic requirements are complete on-hand, the applicant will have to book an online consular appointment service and secure a confirmed appointment at: <https://www.aganapcg.info>

To book a consular appointment, please do the following:

1. Visit [www.aganapcg.info](http://www.aganapcg.info)
2. Click the banner on **Book Consular Appointment**;
3. Choose the Consular Service you wish to avail; and
4. Click the date and time.

Note: New Consular appointment slots are made available to the public on a daily basis. Due to the large number of applicants, it is advisable to monitor [www.aganapcg.info](http://www.aganapcg.info) daily to secure your consular appointment.

Only those with confirmed appointments will be accepted at the Consulate General. Please come only on the scheduled day and time slot. You must bring with you the complete set of photocopies of requirements for submission, payment, and processing of your visa application.

**DO NOT BOOK AN ONLINE APPOINTMENT FOR VISA ISSUANCE UNLESS YOUR VISA DOCUMENTS ARE IN ORDER AND COMPLETE**

If approved, your visa will be issued within two (2) days from actual submission of visa application and required supporting documents at the Consulate General.

**FOR THOSE WHO DO NOT FALL UNDER ANY OF THE ABOVE MENTIONED EXEMPTIONS, NO VISA CAN BE ISSUED.**

***However, if the reason for travel to the Philippines is to avail of medical services there, the visa applicant may submit a letter request citing all justifications and attaching proof thereof such as:***

1. Request letter of exemption from travel restrictions explaining the circumstances of the request;
2. Medical certificate indicating the urgency of the medical treatment and the unavailability of such treatment in Guam;
3. DOH Medical Clearance (you or your next-of-kin in the PHL may get the endorsement either directly or through the assistance of your medical healthcare provider like St Luke's Medical Center; (NOTE: As per policy of the Inter-Agency Task Force on the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) the applicant would need to submit an endorsement from the Secretary of the Department of Health (DOH) in the Philippines or his authorized representative addressed to the Secretary of Foreign Affairs that his case is a medical emergency requiring him to get treatment in the Philippines. The applicant may wish to ask the assistance of his next of kin in the Philippines or his doctor to coordinate with DOH through [ftduque@doh.gov.ph](mailto:ftduque@doh.gov.ph) in requesting said endorsement); and
4. Copy of Birth Certificate and Copy of Passport.

**REMINDER: SUBMISSION OF THE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS IS NOT A GUARANTEE OF APPROVAL.**

**The Consulate General WILL NOT, under any circumstances,**

1. Issue the visa on the same day just to accommodate the visa applicant's flight schedule; and
2. Refund the visa application fee if the visa is issued later than the flight departure date or if the visa application is denied.

It is always the prerogative of the visa officer or the Consul to request additional documents as may be necessary to help determine whether or not the applicant can be issued a visa.
